Cameron Boozer | 6-9 Forward | 2025 | Columbus (FL)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Finisher, Facilitator, Toughness, High Motor, Rim Runner, Rebounder, Defender

Projection Range: HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Absolute pro who will be a franchise culture changer from day one in the NBA due to his rare blend of positional tools, athleticism, BBIQ and intangibles. Dominated the competition on both ends of the floor throughout the week, leading Columbus to a tournament championship. Will have no shortage of options from a program standpoint and projects to be one of the top picks in his draft class

Tajh Ariza | 6-6.5 Wing | 2026 | St. Bernard (CA)

Roles: Versatility, Scorer, Creator

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: High upside wing with an intriguing blend of physical tools, fluid athleticism and perimeter skillset. Remains inconsistent as a decision maker and shooter, but the foundation is there for him to continue improving. Was the de facto number one option on his team due to the talent gap with his teammates, which resulted in him trying to do too much offensively. More of a versatile second or third option who can generate mis-matches and feed off of others at this stage

Alec Blair | 6-6 Guard | 2025 | De La Salle (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Versatility, Creator, Scorer, Finisher, Toughness, High Motor, Defender

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 80%)

Bottom Line: Versatile guard who has really developed physically since evaluated at this event last year and now stands at 6'6" with a 6'10"+ wingspan and big hands. Impressed with his competitive edge, tough finishing, clutch ISO scoring and switchability on defense. Special two sport athlete who elevates his team and always gives them a chance to win. Will likely have a productive multi-year college career that could result in him being drafted into both the NBA and MLB

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Cayden Boozer | 6-5 Guard | 2025 | Columbus (FL)

Roles: High BBIQ, Creator, Facilitator, Slasher, Finisher, Toughness, Defender

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Skilled player who tends to get overshadowed by his brother, but brings a lot to the table in his own right. Has really progressed over the past year and had a number of impressive moments as the lead guard for Columbus, both as a patient creator and crafty facilitator. Needs to continue improving his shot consistency, showed flashes of stretching the floor, but still does most of his scoring damage around the rim. Is on a positive developmental trajectory and projects to bring creating, facilitating, additional scoring and defensive toughness to a roster. Possible one and done, but most likely a two and done NBA prospect

Carter Bryant | 6-7 Forward | 2024 | Corona Centennial (CA) *Arizona

Roles: Versatility, Creator, Scorer, Finisher, Slasher, High Motor

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: High-upside forward who pops as a future pro with his physical profile, fluidity and versatile skillset, but can leave you wanting more at times. He was one of the more well rounded prospects at the event but at this stage he's good at a lot of things and not great at any one thing. However, Bryant projects to have a productive season for Corona Centennial and if everything continues to develop on schedule, he'll have a chance to be a first round pick after a few years in college

Jason Crowe, Jr. | 6-2 Guard | 2026 | Lynwood (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Crafty Finisher, Toughness, High Motor

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: As one of the more naturally skilled guards in attendance regardless of class, Crowe Jr. is a smooth operator with the ball, crafty finisher and dynamic range shooter. The feel for the game is evident, but the next step in his development centers around him becoming more of a facilitator and quarterbacking the offense. Defensively, he's solid, but he could tighten the screws on that end as well. Overall, Crowe Jr. is a proven winner and projects to be a high major one and done prospect who could be the first guard taken in his draft class

Kaden House | 6-3 Guard | 2026 | Desert Mountain (AZ)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Facilitator, Glue Guy, Toughness, High Motor

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Endearing prospect who marries talent with effort and always leaves everything out on the floor. Doesn't necessarily pop from a physical or athletic standpoint, but is a skilled all-around guard who creates for himself and others, can score from a variety of spots on the floor, fills up the stat sheet and helps lead his team to victories. Projects to have a productive college career and get paid to play basketball for a living

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Brandon McCoy, Jr. | 6-3 Guard | 2026 | St. John Bosco (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Toughness, High Motor, Defender

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Smart, tough guard who showcased his polished scoring, advanced feel for the game, creating ability and competitiveness on both ends of the floor. Body and athleticism have noticeably improved over the past 6 months as he's bigger, stronger, quicker and more explosive. Could stand to improve his defensive discipline and ability to make teammates better, but is trending in the right direction as a prospect. Potential lottery pick in the near future

Elzie Harrington | 6-5 Guard | 2025 | St. John Bosco (CA)

Roles: Scorer, Finisher, Creator

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 90%)

Bottom Line: High major talent who seems to be at a turning point in his development and needs to lock in more if he's to fully tap into his potential. Brings scoring, creating, athleticism and positional size to a roster, but needs to improve his consistency, feel for the game and intangibles. Still a lot to be excited about, but fit will be crucial for his long term pro outlook. Possible transfer portal target if not a draft pick after his freshman season

Mercy Miller | 6-4 Guard | 2024 | Notre Dame Sherman Oaks (CA) *Houston

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Smooth operator both as a creator and multi-level scorer at the combo guard spot. Did an admirable job shouldering a heavier offensive load with the departures of Caleb Foster [Duke] and Dusty Stromer [Gonzaga] while maintaining efficiency. Needs to improve his stamina in order to play both ends of the floor more effectively, but showed a willingness to battle. Possible one and done, but is most likely a multi-year prospect who adds to his game each season until he's ready to enter the draft

Cameron Williams | 6-9 Forward | 2026 | St. Mary's (AZ)

Roles: Versatility, Finisher, Stretch Big, Rim Runner, Rim Protector

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: Aside from Cody Williams and Koa Peat, Cameron Williams looks like he could be the next legitimate high major and NBA prospect to come out of Arizona. At 15 years old, Williams' long 6'9" frame and fluid athleticism immediately pop as someone with immense upside. Couple that with his budding perimeter skillset, baseline feel for the game and defensive versatility and you get a player with the tools to excel at every level. Even though he's still early in his development, the flashes are special enough to warrant high major attention currently

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Tounde Yessoufou | 6-6 Wing | 2025 | St. Joseph (CA)

Roles: Versatility, Finisher, Slasher, Toughness, High Motor, Rebounder, Defender

Projection Range: HM to HM+ (confidence level: 90%)

Bottom Line: Physical freak who initially burst onto the national scene after this event last year. Continues to make strides as a scorer, finisher, creator and defensive menace, but has yet to take that major leap in his game from a BBIQ standpoint. Expectations can be a bit skewed for him due to his natural tools, but the hope is that he'll eventually translate to a wing instead of a slightly undersized power forward. However, the blend of tools, motor and two-way upside are very real and project him to be an impactful college prospect at the high major level regardless of final position. Possible one and done who would benefit from an extra year or two of college development before he's ready to make the jump to the pros

Isaac Carr | 6-4 Guard | 2025 | Central Catholic (OR)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Facilitator, High Motor

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: Cerebral guard with solid size and plus all-around athleticism who can absolutely carve up defenses. Carr showcased his quick processing ability, aggressive mindset, comfort level with the ball, playmaking chops, multi-level scoring, excellent stamina and willingness to defend throughout the week. Would thrive in more of a free flowing/uptempo system, but has the IQ to adjust to any setting. Should garner attention from high major programs, but might be more of an impact player at a mid major. Possible draft pick in a few years if things break right

Eric Freeny | 6-4 Guard | 2024 | Corona Centennial (CA) *UCLA

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Rebounder, High Motor, Defender

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Fundamentally sound and reliable prospect who wasted little time establishing himself as the go to option for Corona Centennial now that many of the upperclassmen from last season are gone. Isn't the flashiest player, but puts his head down and produces as a creator, scorer, rebounder and competitor. Is more of a methodical player who navigates screens and picks defenses apart as a midrange shooter/finisher and would excel in a half-court offense. Likely productive college prospect who will remain in school until he's ready to make the jump

Winters Grady | 6-5.5" Forward | 2025 | Tualatin (OR)

Roles: Scorer, Creator

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 90%)

Bottom Line: Can tend to function as a volume shooter/scoring guard on O, but likely going to guard more forwards than guards...kind of a tweener in that regard. Has made some massive strides over the past year and put together another strong weekend with Tualatin. More of an offensively minded prospect who plays with a competitive edge, but will need to continue showing he's a reliable decision maker who can remain impactful if the shot isn't falling. Talented prospect who may end up transferring multiple times if not on track to enter the NBA early

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Rob Hinton | 6-4 Guard | 2024 | Harvard-Westlake (CA) *Harvard

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Toughness, High Motor

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Has been a big stock riser nationally this summer and he continued to show why this weekend with strong performances against ranked programs. Makes up for his lack of elite tools with a high feel for the game, all-around skillset and leave it all out on the floor approach. No doubt he's going to get the most out of his abilities. Potential to have an illustrious college career at Harvard and be one of the more coveted grad transfers on the market if he doesn't declare for the draft

Jamier Jones | 6-6 Wing | 2025 | Oak Ridge (FL)

Roles: High Flyer, Finisher, Slasher, Creator

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 80%)

Bottom Line: Gifted athlete who is fast in the open court and can finish above the rim at a legit 6'6" and a strong frame. Can see why he was a monster WR during his early football years. Tends to rely too much on his natural talent than fine tuning the details in his game, which was fine as he was transitioning to the high school scene, but now's the time for him to start focusing on his skill development before other prospects pass him up. Showed he can act as a secondary creator, put pressure on the rim and be a force on the glass. Needs to improve his touch and go motor, defensive focus and shot consistency if he's to impact winning at the college level and make millions more in his pro career. This is a big year for him

Nik Khamenia | 6-8 Forward | 2025 | Harvard-Westlake (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Versatility, Toughness

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: Skilled and confident forward with intriguing physical upside, a mature feel for the game, rapidly developing perimeter skillset and versatility. Wasn't afraid of the big stage and showcased his creating and savvy scoring ability for Harvard Westlake, especially in half court settings. Is more of a stiffer athlete who makes up for his lack of quickness and explosiveness with craft and anticipation. Multi-year prospect who isn't for every high major program, but has a real shot to be an impact underclassman and draft riser in the near future depending where he lands

Brayden Kyman | 6-7 Forward | 2026 | Santa Margarita Catholic (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Shooter, Slasher, Facilitator, Versatility

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: Cerebral forward who is the focal point offensively for a well coached Santa Margarita team and impressed with his unselfishness, BBIQ, efficiency, range shooting, smart cutting and finish abilities. Versatile offensive weapon that has always been advanced for his age but continues to get sharper at every aspect of his game. Lack of athleticism could be a hindrance in some areas long term, especially as a defender, but tends to make up for it with his size and skill. Trending in the right direction and should garner more high major attention

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Trent Perry | 6-4 Guard | 2024 | Harvard-Westlake (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Shooter, Creator, Facilitator, Defender

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Reliable combo guard who brings a high BBIQ, shooting, secondary creating, facilitating and underrated defense to a roster. Started off his Harvard Westlake career as more of a one dimensional shooter, but has slowly expanded his game each season to be able to operate with the ball. More of a high floor system prospect with some plug and play upside who will most likely develop into a valued starter after his freshman season. The BBIQ and ability to play off other talented players bodes well for his long term pro outlook as well. Will be 19.5 years old when arriving on a college campus in June 2024

Jasir Rencher | 6-6 Wing | 2025 | Archbishop Riordan (CA)

Roles: High Flyer, Versatility, Finisher, Slasher, Toughness, Defender

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 80%)

Bottom Line: One of the stock risers from the weekend due to his eye-catching tools, plus athleticism and ability to star in his role. Still learning how good he can be and started to transition to more of a featured piece for Riordan by the end the tournament. Cement is still wet when it comes to his perimeter skills such as shooting, creating and facilitating, but there's reason for optimism in each one of those areas. Possible late bloomer who could have a productive senior season and find himself in the NBA in a few short years. High major talent who warrants more looks

Isaiah Rogers | 6-1 Guard | 2026 | Corona Centennial (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Creator, Facilitator, Crafty Finisher

Projection Range: HM (confidence level: 90%)

Bottom Line: Crafty guard who held his own against older competition and gained valuable reps as a starter for Corona Centennial. Rogers showcased his ability to run an offense, generate paint touches, find shooters and finish with touch inside. As a 2026 prospect, he's still very much developing both physically and athletically, but has made noticeable strides in both areas over the past year. Aside from maturing, the next phases of his development include becoming tougher defensively and stretching the floor more frequently. There's a chance Rogers blossoms into a 6'3"+ lead guard with very few holes in his game by the time he's a senior. Prospect worth monitoring closely on the West Coast

Malik Abdullahi | 6-8 Forward | 2024 | Columbus (FL)

Roles: Versatility, Finisher, Slasher, Rebounder, Toughness, High Motor, Defender

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Physically and athletically gifted hybrid forward who does a good job buying into his role as a finisher, slasher, rebounder and versatile defender, but may have more to his game than meets the eye and seems more comfortable playing on his EYBL team [Nightrydas] than he does with Columbus. Has the tools and potential to play at a high major, but could be a sleeper pickup for a mid major program

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Jase Butler | 6-4 Guard | 2024 | Branson (CA)

Roles: High BBIQ, Creator, Scorer, Facilitator, High Motor, Toughness, Defender

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 85%)

Bottom Line: Reliable and well rounded prospect with an impressive feel for the game, high motor and size to play either guard spot. Showed he can compliment others and was effective sharing the creating duties with 2025 guard Semetri Carr. Put together a strong weekend and should be one of the more coveted rising seniors on the west coast. Multi-year prospect who will get paid to play basketball and has a chance to turn himself into an NBA player down the road

Liam Campbell | 6-5 Guard | 2024 | Owyhee (ID)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Toughness, Glue Guy, High Motor

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 85%)

Bottom Line: Do it all type of player for Owyhee who brings competitiveness, toughness, scoring, creating, BBIQ, energy and leadership to a roster. Not the flashiest or most athletic prospect, but he brings his lunch pail to the gym everyday. Likely multi-year prospect who can develop from a reliable bench contributor to a starter within a year or two

Jacob Cofie | 6-9 Big | 2024 | Eastside Catholic (WA)

Roles: Finisher, Scorer, Rim Runner

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Can be a frustrating player as he has the talent to dominate, but bails out the defense far too often with his poor decision making. Has a bit too much offensive freedom on the team and tries to play more like a guard instead of taking advantage of his strengths as a fluid 6'9" forward. Upside to be a special player if he improves his motor and buys into a role, but the right fit and trust would be required for that to happen. High major talent who could be better off at a mid major program

Christian Collins | 6-7 Forward | 2026 | St. Bernard (ST) (not listed on roster)

Roles: Versatility, Finisher, Creator, Scorer

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 90%)

Bottom Line: Another one of the major stock risers from the weekend and is a naturally skilled and versatile prospect with immense upside. Is in the midst of a major growth spurt and has transitioned from a small guard to rangy forward over the past year. Has a chance to get to 6'10" while maintaining his perimeter skills. Still in the early phases of his development, but flashes some shot creation, touch around the basket and switchability on defense throughout the tournament. Will need to improve his consistency and add toughness over the years, but the sky's the limit if it all clicks. Possible one and done prospect

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Lattimore Ford | 6-6 Guard | 2026 | Mount Si (WA)

Roles: Versatility, Finisher, Slasher, Rebounder

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 95%)

Bottom Line: In theory Ford brings versatility, athleticism, straight line driving, tough finishing, rebounding and defense to a roster, but he was a bit of a tease throughout the weekend due to inconsistency. Has the talent to significantly alter games on both ends of the ball when engaged, but preferred to lay low for long stretches and let the action come to him. However, still only a 2026 prospect, Ford possesses immense two-way upside and projects to be a top 75 prospect in his class by the time his high school career is over. Should garner more high major attention if he continues to put it all together

Nate Garcia | 7-0 Big | 2025 | Damien (CA)

Roles: Finisher, Rebounder, Toughness

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 85%)

Bottom Line: More of a traditional big who rebounds, sets screens and finishes around the basket. Does a good job of keeping the game simple and playing his role. Defensively, Garcia has the size to guard other plodding bigs, but lacks footspeed and gets picked apart in space. Double-double machine who still has time to develop and would be that much more valuable if he started stretching the floor. High major prospect if things break right, but likely multi-year prospect who has a productive career at a mid-major

Andrew Hilman | 6-4 Guard | 2026 | Archbishop Riordan (CA)

Roles: Versatility, Finisher, Slasher, Creator, Defender

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Intriguing 2026 combo guard with a muscular frame, size, plus length and projectable athleticism. Skill development is a work in progress, but excels as a slasher, finisher and secondary creator offensively. At his best as a versatile defender who uses his lateral quickness, length and toughness to get stops. Lot to be encouraged about going forward and has the potential to play at a MM to HM level

Chace Holley | 6-1 Guard | 2026 | Lynwood (CA)

Roles: Creator, Finisher, Slasher, Toughness

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: Solid all-around guard who isn't all that flashy, but tends to get the job done. Is part of a talented and young three guard lineup alongside Jason Crowe Jr and Aiden McIntyre. Crowe Jr. leads the group, but Holley does a good job complimenting others and will routinely have big games as well. Is a strong/stout guard who can play on or off the ball, is a tough finisher, secondary creator and pesky defender. Needs to continue becoming a consistent shooter and stay aggressive from one game to the next if he's to tap into his full potential. Is a MM to HM talent if he continues on his current trajectory

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Kalek House | 6-3 Guard | 2026 | Desert Mountain (AZ)

Roles: Creator, Facilitator, Slasher, High Motor

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 80%)

Bottom Line: Solid combo guard who does a good job complimenting others by acting as a secondary creator, facilitator, slasher and energetic presence. Showed glimpses of his outside shooting, but is an area of his game that still appears to be developing. Tends to defer to his brother Kaden and will fill in the gaps from there. Reason for optimism due to age, foundational skillset and pedigree. Will only keep getting better and is a player worth keeping tabs on

Brody Kozlowski | 6-7 Forward | 2024 | Corner Canyon (UT)

Roles: Shooter, Slasher, Finisher, Toughness, High Motor

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 100%)

Bottom Line: Reliable prospect who thrives within a system and always seems to put up similar production regardless of competition. Is more of a functional athlete who possesses solid specs at the forward position with a strong 6'7" frame and ok length. Offensively, Kozlowski is a very self-aware prospect and excels as a floor stretcher, slasher, tough finisher and straight line driver. Defensively, he plays with a care factor and sets the tone physically, but his lack of elite lateral quickness and length could be a hindrance at the next level. Likely bench contributor with starter equity at a HM level and could have a productive and efficient college career before turning pro

Mason Magee | 6-0 Guard | 2026 | Basha (AZ)

Roles: High BBIQ, Creator, Scorer, Toughness, Defender

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 65%)

Bottom Line: Underrated guard who brings maturity and two-way production to a roster. Nothing all that spectacular about how he produces, but does a good job making the simple play, be it as a creator, facilitator or scorer. Also showed quick hands and toughness on the defensive end, and is able to punch above his listed size on that end. Still developing in numerous areas, but the current player framework is encouraging. Has a chance to be a productive floor general at the college level for multiple years

Josh Palmer | 6-4 Guard | 2025 | St. Bernard (CA)

Roles: Creator, Slasher

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: Upside guard who played with confidence and made the most of his offensive opportunities with St. Bernard by stretching the floor, slashing and creating for others. Still young at a listed 6'4" with plus length and a frame that should mature nicely over time. Seems to be a year or two away from putting it all together, but initial signs are encouraging and is another West Coast prospect to monitor

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Delton Prescott | 5-10 Guard | 2027 | Sunnyslope (AZ)

Roles: High BBIQ, Creator, Facilitator, Crafty Finisher, Scorer, Toughness, High Motor

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 80%)

Bottom Line: Young 2027 guard who has room to grow physically and athletically, but plays with a maturity beyond his years and didn't back down from older competition. Was a reliable floor general for Sunnyslope and kept the offense humming by striking the balance between scoring and facilitating. Defensively, Prescott is hardly imposing, but he showed his lateral quickness and toughness. Overall, he has a chance to be one of the more polished guards in his class and projects to be a MM to HM talent by the time he's ready to commit

Julius Price | 6-3 Guard | 2026 | St. Joseph (CA)

Roles: Shooter, Slasher

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: More of a one dimensional player at this stage who brings knockdown shooting and off ball movement to a roster. Helped space the floor and create more driving lanes for teammates such as Tounde Yessoufou and projects to do the same at the college level. Able to hold his own both physically and athletically and will continue improving in both as he's only a 2026 prospect. Overall, Price is a valuable role player with a bankable skill and has a chance to be a plug and play guy by the time he's ready to enter college

Zion Sensley | 6-7 Wing | 2024 | Archbishop Riordan (CA)

Roles: Scorer, Creator, Versatility

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 75%)

Bottom Line: Slightly unorthodox player with HM tools and talent, but lacks consistency in both his production and decision making. Tries to do too much for his team at times and ends up bailing out the defense with a tough shot or turning the ball over when attacking. Seems to have regressed a bit in his development the past few months and would do better in more of a rigid system that would allow him to simplify his game, focus on his strengths and slowly expand from there. Running faster than he can walk right now. Overall, Sensley still has a blend of tools, fluidity and upside that can't be taught and could be a solid developmental piece for a MM to HM program

CJ Shaw | 6-4 Guard | 2025 | Mojave (NV)

Roles: High BBIQ, Scorer, Creator, Slasher, Facilitator

Projection Range: MM to HM (confidence level: 80%)

Bottom Line: Dynamic scoring guard who can put up points in a hurry and had one of the higher scoring games of the weekend with 37 points. He did a good job playing with patience by taking what the defense gave him and by getting his shots up within the flow of the offense. As a fluid athlete with solid size, Shaw showed he can also act as a secondary creator and facilitator when called upon and projects to continue improving in both of those areas next season. Defensively, Shaw passes the test from a tools and lateral quickness standpoint, but needs to add strength and toughness if he's to not get punked at the next level. Overall, he's on a positive developmental track and appears to have quite a bit of untapped potential even with the current production. Could peak at the right time as he enters college and is a player worth tracking

Projects to be a sound role player who contributes to the team's culture and becomes a long term starter. Not a surefire NBA prospect, but has a chance to get there as an upperclassman

Bottom Line: Complementary player with an intriguing physical profile and fluid athleticism. Still has a lot of developing to do, but is a player to track going forward
